Use this worksheet to practice what is discussed in

- **Information sheet 11: *Using Concordancers to Improve Written Academic English.***

Some of the exercises on this sheet can be completed using any concordancer (e.g., Ludwig, Sketch Engine/SkELL, COCA, AntConc). For others, only some concordancers can be used. You will learn most by completing the tasks using different concordancers.

For the following tasks, first use concordancers to answer the questions posed, or decide which of the two alternatives is correct or more common. Second, check your answer using a concordancer. Where alternative answers appear to be possible, can you identify a reason why?
